

## ● Grants for geographical research, exploration, fieldwork and teaching

### Established Researchers

#### **Thesiger-Oman International Research Fellowships**

Two awards of up to £8,000 for research in the physical & human environment in arid and semi-arid lands. Supported by His Majesty Qaboos bin Said Al Said, Sultan of Oman, in memory of Sir Wilfred Thesiger. Applicants must be established researchers affiliated with a university anywhere in the world. **Deadline: 27 November 2009**

#### **Peter Fleming Award**

A single grant of up to £9,000 for senior researchers for the advancement of geographical science. The award is provided in memory of the late Peter Fleming. Applicants should be British and can be either an individual or part of a collaborative project. **Deadline: 27 November 2009**

#### **Ralph Brown Expedition Award**

A single grant of up to £15,000 for the study of shallow aquatic/marine environments at a senior academic level. The award is given annually in memory of the late Ralph Brown. The award is open to Society Fellows from anywhere in the world. **Deadline: 27 November 2009**

#### **Gilchrist Fieldwork Award (biennial)**

A single grant of up to £15,000 given biennially to a team of senior scholarly researchers. It is open to teams of up to ten members, the majority of whom should be British, conducting original and challenging research which will be of benefit to the host nation. The award is administered by the RGS-IBG on behalf of the Gilchrist Education Trust. **Deadline: 26 February 2010**

### Early Career Researchers

#### **EPSRC Geographical Research Grants**

Grants of up to £3,000 are available annually for original desk and/or field-based research by the Engineering & Physical Sciences Research Council (EPSRC). The research proposal must focus on one of the following topics; 21st century infrastructure; waste, pollution and urban land use; urban transport and design; an inclusive environment; climate change; flooding. **Deadline: 22 January 2010**

#### **RGS-IBG Small Research Grants**

Grants of up to £3,000 are available annually for original desk and/or field-based research. These awards are aimed at scholarly researchers in the early stages of their career and are only available to Royal Geographical Society (with IBG) Fellows. Awards are intended to assist early career researchers at British higher education institutions. **Deadline: 22 January 2010**

#### **Jasmin Leila Award**

An Award of up to £250 given as a supplement to one of the projects supported under the Society's Small Research Grant scheme or as an independent award. The Jasmin Leila Award is given in celebration of Jasmin Leila Sidaway. Projects should focus on either: medical/health geography, performance geographies and transnational communities. **Deadline: 22 January 2010**

#### **20<sup>th</sup> International Geographical Congress**

**Award** An Award of up to £3,000 is available to individual researchers pursuing geographical research working in a UK higher education institution. The fund was established following the 20<sup>th</sup> International Geographical Congress held in London in 1964. **Deadline: 22 January 2010**

#### **30<sup>th</sup> International Geographical Congress**

**Award** Five grants of up to £750 to assist with the cost of attending an international conference. The conference must be organised by a geographical (or geographically related) organisation, association or union. Priority will be given for conferences outside Europe and North America, and to early career researchers. **Deadline: 15 February 2010**

### Students

#### **RGS-IBG Postgraduate Research Grants**

Awards of up to £2000 for PhD students undertaking fieldwork/ data collection. Two awards will be offered in each of the following areas: physical environment; conservation/ sustainability; and society/ economy. Preference will be given to research that both furthers geographical knowledge and also demonstrates applied benefits. **Deadline: 27 November 2009**
